


# Team Goals for the Double Bayou Project

- Assist with the creation of a partnership to improve water quality in Double Bayou that will:
  - Remove/prevent the impairment listing of both forks of the bayou.
- Assist with the development of a Watershed Protection Plan (WPP) that will:
  - Identify voluntary measures that stakeholders would implement to improve water quality in their watershed.

## The Partnership





- A stakeholder is anyone who:
  - Is <u>affected</u> by the decisions;
  - Has <u>interest</u> in the decisions;

- or -

Can <u>influence</u> the results of decisions.

# More Considerations for Stakeholders

- Responsible for implementation of the plan
- Affected by implementation of the plan
- Provide information on the watershed and the issues and concerns
- Have knowledge of existing programs or plans that could be integrated into the plan
- Provide technical and/or financial assistance in developing

#### Roles for a Decision-Making Body

# A decision-making body could:

- Represent stakeholders in making decisions for the Partnership.
- Help develop and sign the WPP document.
- Communicate the WPP to affected parties.
- Lead the effort to implement the WPP.



## Considerations for Membership in a Decision-Making Body

- Local stakeholders
- Represent balance of interests developed by the stakeholders
- Individuals identified through selfnomination or strategic partners
- Make commitment to participate
- Develop, and agree to, ways to work together

#### Possible Goals for Operating Procedures or Ground Rules



- Foster participation
- Build partnerships
- Focus on constructive discussion
- Provide a means to achieve project goals



#### Example Elements of Operating Procedures or Ground Rules





- Description of roles and responsibilities of the key participants & groups
- Information on meetings and materials
- Decision-making process



## Work Groups

- Work groups are established by the decision-making body to address specific issues.
- Work groups might include at least one member of the decision-making body.





## Examples of Work Groups

- Wastewater Infrastructure: treatment facilities, onsite septic systems
- Agricultural Nonpoint Sources
- Development Nonpoint Sources: urban stormwater, pet waste, construction
- Habitat, Wildlife & Feral Hogs
- Industrial & Commercial











## Technical Advisory Group

- Coordinated by TSSWCB and HARC, with stakeholder input.
- Provide information and resources for developing the plan.
- Bring resources to the DB project from other related projects.
